Noting Wolfpack Baseball

Head Coach Elliott Avent

Through games of March 18, NCState's Elliott Avent held a 428-263 record in his 11-plus seasons at NC State. Avent is the second-winningest coach in school history, trailing Sam Esposito, who went 513-253 from 1967-87. Counting his eight years at New Mexico State, Avent is 653-474 in 19-plus seasons as a head coach.

NC State vs. Clemson

Clemson leads the all-time series with NCState by a 99-66-1 margin. In the 11 years as head coach of the Wolfpack, Elliott Avent has a 14-24 mark vs. Clemson, including a 10-5 mark at Doak Field at Dail Park and a 2-1 record at Kinston's Grainger Stadium (2003). Avent has not fared well at Doug Kingsmore Stadium in Clemson, dropping 12 of 14 meetings with the Tigers there, including the last seven, and nine of the last 10. NCState last won a series at Clemson in 1996.

Inflicting Payne

Senior right fielder Matt Payne had seven hits in the Miami series March 14-16 and concluded the series with a game-winning three-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning in the Sunday finale. Payne went 2-for-4 and scored a run in the series opener, then went 2-for-3 and drove in a run in the middle game. In the finale, Payne singled, doubled, homered and drove in three runs as the Wolfpack rallied to defeat the Hurricanes 11-10 in a game shortened to eight innings by Miami's travel plans.

Heading into the Clemson series, Payne has hit safely in five of his last six games, batting .450 (9-for-20) with two doubles, a home run, six RBIs, two strikeouts and five walks in those six games.

So When Is A Walk-Off Homer Not A Walk-Off Homer?

Matt Payne's game-winning three-run home run in the eighth inning of NCState's 11-10 victory over Miami on March 16 essentially ended the game because of Miami's travel plans. With Miami due to catch a 7:20 p.m. flight out of Raleigh-Durham International Airport, the umpiring crew decided before the game that no inning could start after 4:45 p.m. The eighth inning started at about 4:35, and Payne's homer was hit at 4:47, which should have ended the game as a walk-off homer. Plate umpire Joe Marion, apparently unaware that the 4:45 curfew already had passed, allowed Carlos Gutierrez to make one pitch to Russell Wilson, the next hitter in the Wolfpack line-up after Payne, before stopping the game. That made Payne's home run the first walk-off homer in NCState history that did not actually end the game.

Eight Innings Of Fireworks

NC State and Miami gave the scoreboard operator at Doak Field at Dail Park a serious workout in the finale of their three-game series March 16. The two teams played just eight innings due to Miami's travel plans, yet still combined to score 21 runs on 29 hits, including 10 doubles, a triple and four home runs.

Clayton Shunick Emerges As An Ace

Junior righthander Clayton Shunick was a valuable and versatile pitcher for NCState a year ago, compiling a 6-3 record and a 6.15 ERA in 21 appearances. Shunick was good in 2007, but he has emerged as the early-season staff ace in 2008. In four appearances, two of them starts, Shunick is 2-1 with a 0.78 ERA. In his one loss, a 2-1 decision to a Miami team that has to rank among the best offensive teams in the country, Shunick allowed two runs on five hits in six innings of work. A week earlier, on March 8, Shunick made his first start of 2008 and was masterful, earning ACC Player of the Week honors after shutting out Virginia on three hits through eight innings.

Prior to the Virginia game, Shunick was pitching out of the bullpen, and was pitching like an ace in relief. In two extended outings out of the pen, Shunick pitched nine innings and allowed just one run, unearned, on seven hits, no walks and nine strikeouts. He held opposing hitters to a .212 batting average and allowed just three baserunners to reach scoring position. For the season, he has pitched 23 innings and allowed just three runs, two of them earned, on 15 hits with three walks and 23 strikeouts.

Clayton Shunick Voted ACC Pitcher of the Week

Junior righthander Clayton Shunick's three-hit masterpiece vs. Virginia on March 8 was so impressive that the Atlantic Coast Conference's Player-of-the-Week media panel unanimously voted Shunick the conference's Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 3-9. Shunick worked a career-high eight innings against the Cavaliers, shutting them out on three hits. He walked one and struck out a career-high nine. Shunick allowed just four Virginia baserunners to reach scoring position. He also pitched around three NCState errors.

Clearing The Scoreboard

So far in 2008, NCState has had two hitters belt home runs that cleared the scoreboard in left-center field. Marcus Jones did it March 12 vs. Quinnipiac, and Chris Schaeffer did it March 16 vs. Miami.

Pitching Carries The Day

NCState won its opening three-game Atlantic Coast Conference of the season, March 8-9 vs. Virginia, on the strength of airtight pitching. The Wolfpack won two of three games against the Cavaliers, despite hitting just .207 (19-for-92) for the series and scoring just nine runs in the three games. In the two games it won, NCState batted .185 (10-for-54). In those same two games, pitchers Clayton Shunick, Eryk McConnell, Alex Sogard, Jake Buchanan and Jimmy Gillheeny combined to allow just two runs, one of them unearned, on seven hits in 18 innings. Wolfpack pitchers walked three and struck out 17 in the two victories over UVa. The Cavaliers batted just .108 (7-for-65) in the two games. For the three-game series, NCState pitchers had a 1.93 ERA in 28 innings, allowing 19 hits, walking six and striking out 29.

Jake Buchanan Stymies Miami

Freshman righthander Jake Buchanan has proven to be an integral part of NCState's bullpen in 2008, never more so than on March 15 vs. Miami. With the Wolfpack trailing the Hurricanes 2-1 after six innings, Buchanan came on in relief of starter Clayton Shunick and cruised through the final three innings, retiring all nine men he faced on just 27 pitches, an average of three pitches per batter. In his last three appearances, Buchanan has allowed one run on three hits in 7 2/3 innings. For the season, he has a 1.59 in 11 1/3 innings.

How Do You Spell Relief?

NCState's bullpen is 8-2 with a 1.76 ERA and six saves. Wolfpack relievers have inherited 38 baserunners and stranded all but 13. In the last eight games, NCState relievers have allowed just five earned runs in 39 1/3 innings, a 1.14 ERA.

Jimmy Gillheeny Gets Back-To-Back Saves

NCState pitching coach Tom Holliday has expressed doubts that the Wolfpack will have one set closer for the 2008 season. Sophomore left-hander Jimmy Gillheeny is making a case that he can handle the job, however. In six appearances, all in relief, Gillheeny has pitched 11 innings, allowed one run on four hits, won one game and recorded three saves. He has walked three and struck out 15. Gillheeny has won or saved the last four games in which he has appeared, working 5 2/3 innings with one run on one hit, one walk and eight strikeouts. Against Virginia on March 8 in the second game of a doubleheader, Gillheeny set down the side in order on 10 pitches in the ninth inning to preserve Clayton Shunick's three-hit shutout. Gillheeny came back the next afternoon and struck out the only two men he faced on seven pitches to save a 4-2 win in the series finale for Eryk McConnell. Gillheeny allowed a home run to Miami's Jemile Weeks leading off the top of the eighth inning March 16, but otherwise was perfect over 2 2/3 innings. He got credit for the win when Matt Payne ended the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with a three-run home run.

Inherited Baserunners

Through 17 games, NCState relievers have inherited 38 baserunners and allowed just 13 to score. Kyle Rutter has stranded nine of 11 inherited runners, and Jimmy Gillheeny has stranded six of seven. Joey Cutler has inherited three runners and stranded all three, and Jake Buchanan has inherited two runners and stranded both.

No Decisions For Surkamp

NCState lefthander Eric Surkamp set an unofficial school record as a freshman with seven no-decisions, then matched that a year ago. On March 8 vs. Virginia, Surkamp worked six strong innings, but left with the score tied at 2-2. Surkamp now has 15 no-decisions in 32 career starts, but with the season compacted from 16 weeks to 13 this season, Surkamp probably won't match his school record this season.

Lineup Juggling

With his team scuffling to score runs, NC State coach Elliott Avent has juggled his lineup and milked his roster in an attempt to find the right offensive combination. Through 17 games, Avent has used the same lineup in consecutive games just once. He has used 10 different hitters in the six spot in the lineup, and eight in the five and seven holes. The Wolfpack has used six hitters in the two spot and five in the eight spot.

The most commonly used hitter at any spot in the starting lineup is Dallas Poulk, who been used 10 times in the leadoff spot. Marcus Jones has batted third nine times and Tommy Foschi has hit ninth eight times.

Poulk Streak Stops At 23

Virginia All-American Jacob Thompson and two relievers held Dallas Poulk hitless March 8 in the first game of NCState's three-game ACC series vs. the Cavaliers, snapping Poulk's hitting streak at 23 games. Poulk hit safely in the first six games in which he played in 2008 and batted .346 (9-for-26) in those six games. He also hit safely in the final 17 games of 2007, batting .459 (34-for-74) during those 17 games. Poulk batted .416 (47-for-113) during the 23-game hitting streak, which is the longest by a Wolfpack hitter during the Elliott Avent era. The school record for a hitting streak is 26 games by Greg Briley in 1986. Tom Sergio had a 25-game streak in 1995. Poulk's 23-game streak is the third-longest in NCState history.

Career Day For Drew Martin

Drew Martin's reputation is as a good-fielding, light-hitting infielder. He began the 2008 season on the bench, but after two games he was put in the lineup February 24 vs. Appalachian State at third base to shore up the Wolfpack's infield defense. He also has contributed with the bat, hitting .389 with two doubles and five RBIs in six starts. His first game in the lineup, he had a career-high four hits in as many at-bats, doubled, and tied a career high with three RBIs.

Five Ribbies For Ryan Pond

March 1 vs. North Carolina A&T in Charleston, S.C., Ryan Pond hit a three-run home run, a sacrifice fly and a run-scoring groundout to drive in five runs, one shy of his career high for RBIs. Pond drove in six runs May 6, 2006, when he hit for the cycle vs. Longwood.

Two-Homer Game For Marcus Jones

Junior center fielder Marcus Jones had his first multi-homer game March 12 vs. Quinnipiac. Jones hit his first homer of the game in the bottom of the third inning, a shot to straightaway center field that just eluded the leaping grasp of Bobcats center fielder Brian Monack. Jones's second home run eluded no one's grasp. Only someone riding in a helicopter and using a large butterfly net could have caught Jones's fifth-inning bomb, which cleared the scoreboard in left-center field.

For the season, Jones has not gone back-to-back games without a hit, and has driven in two or more runs in six of his last 11 games.

Devon Cartwright Emerges As Left Fielder

Devon Cartwright came to NCState as an unheralded junior college infielder. Despite never playing the outfielder prior to coming to Raleigh, Cartwright has established himself as the Wolfpack's regular left fielder, showing good instincts in the outfield and a productive bat at the plate. Cartwright has had back-to-back hitless starts just once, and had three hits, including a home run, and four RBIs in his first college start.
